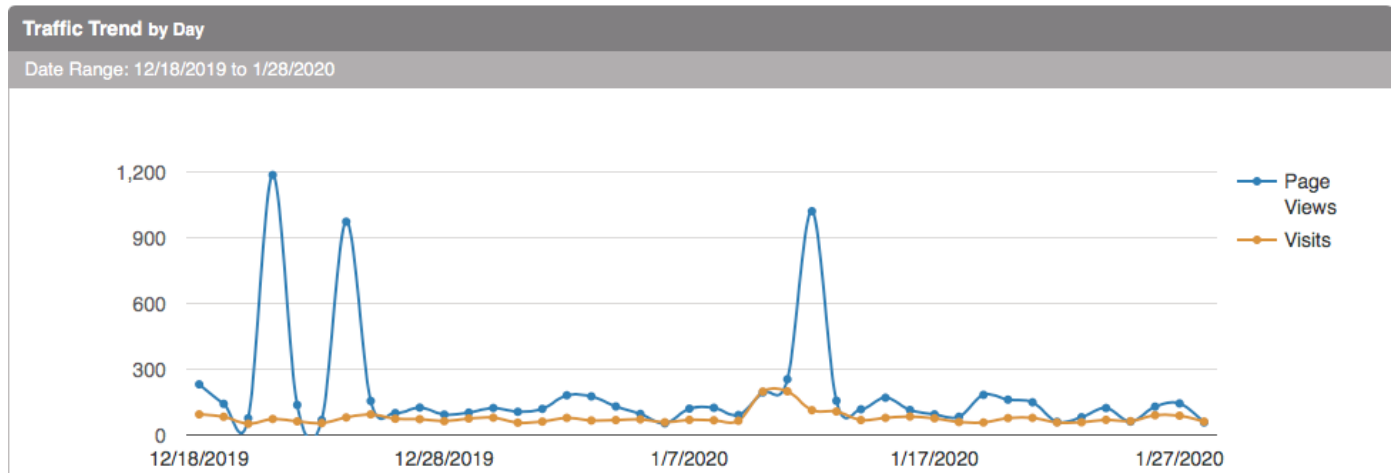
### (2) Website Page Updates

## WEBSITE STATISTICS

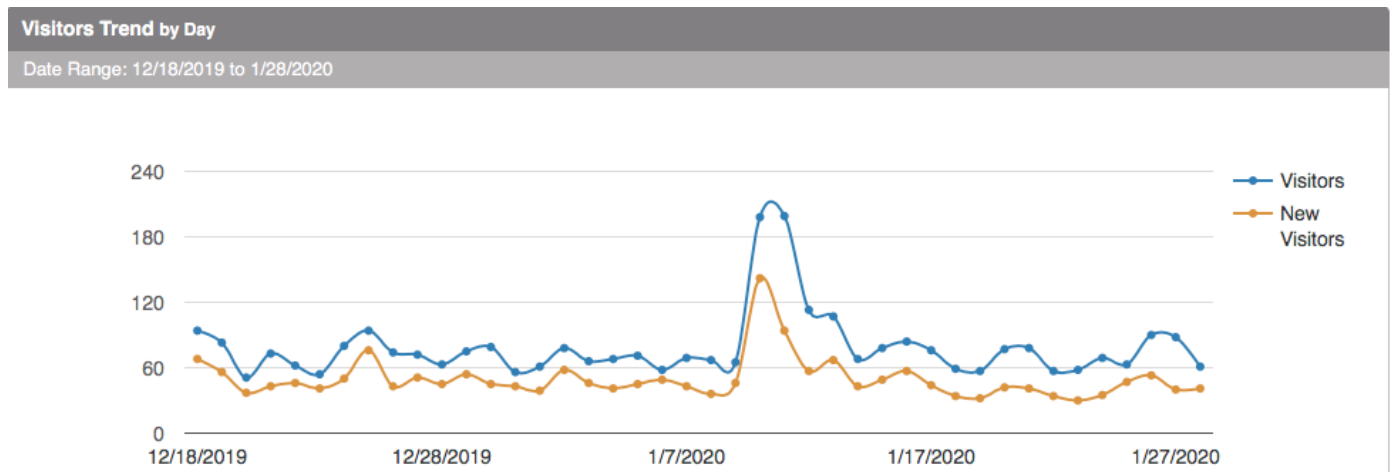
### Site traffic report for December 18, 2019 to January 28, 2020



The Dec 21 and Jan 12 peaks came from IP addresses with a 50% or greater confidence of abuse in the Abuse IP database. I have therefore blocked them from any further access to our site. *(Note the domain name for the second one! Trump has [thousands of websites including the Trump name](#), but I don't know if this is one of his or someone else's, since there is no response from it.)*

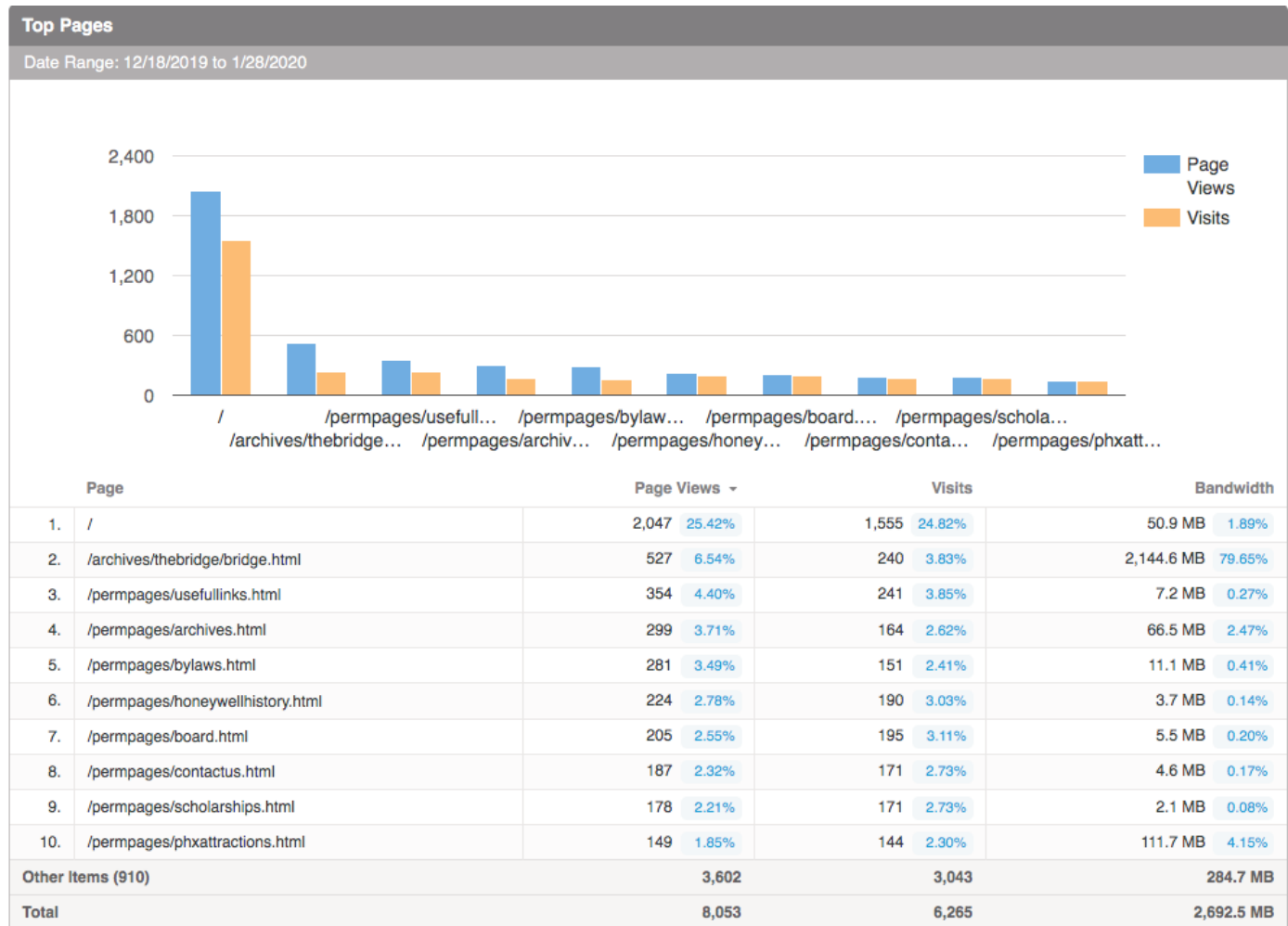
### Site visitors report for December 18, 2019 to January 28, 2020



There were nine IP addresses clustered over Jan 10-11, but most of them were benign, and the most active only had a 30% abuse rating, so no IP addresses blocking was added.

A couple of points:

- (1) There is nothing very remarkable about the top few pages—useful links and archives are often the top pages after the online bridge.
- (2) Note on this entry in the Nov-Dec report: *“There were a lot of visits to old, archived copies of the Online Bridge. (2005, 2010, 2014) A few of these may have been your webmaster, but someone else was looking for old information, which is exactly what the archives are meant to provide.”* We subsequently found out that Ted Rees had been active in this area, so this made perfect sense!

# HRSC Webmaster's Report December 18, 2019 to January 28, 2020

## Demographics

- India had 31% of page views and 20% of bandwidth for the last report, but was not even in the top ten this time. The USA had a big increase from 19% to 76% of page views and from 66% to 97% of bandwidth. The next most active country was Japan with 11% of page views and 1% of bandwidth.
- Within the USA, Michigan, Arizona and Texas were the top states, with respectively 56%, 18% and 16% of page views, and 29%, 56% and 9% of bandwidth. Pennsylvania remained absent, having been a top-two site two periods ago, but having dropped out last period.
- Phoenix and Surprise were the only Valley cities in the top ten US cities and accounted for 11% of page views and 39% of bandwidth among US cities. As in the previous report, the other cities with significant activity were Ann Arbor, MI with 49% page views and 27% of bandwidth and Houston with 15% of page views and 9% of bandwidth. Blue Bell, PA remained out of the top ten, which probably explains Pennsylvania dropping out of the top ten states. Unisys (~\$3bn annual revenue) is based in Blue Bell, so these swings may relate to changes in Unisys activity.
